Sir,

In regard to the matter between Mr John Onions and the Representatives of the late Mr Dukes of Linley. I am of opinion that Mr Onions should allow Four Pounds towards the Barn &c. which was erected at the Expense of the late Mr Dukes and which I conceive the materials would now be worth to remove, also that Mr Onions should pay Five Pounds towards the Value of the Hay Grass growing on the Premises at the time. Mr Dukes died, his representatives paying the Rent up to Mid summer last.
